Terms and conditions for Spitfire flight lottery

The Lions Club of Chichester (“Chichester Lions”) is an independent charity (registration No. 1057110) affiliated to Lions Clubs International.

This lottery is being run under a license granted by Chichester District Council – license registration number: **3815/15/02000/GASSL**

### **THE BENEFICIARY**

The lottery is conducted with the object of raising funds for Kent, Surrey & Sussex Air Ambulance ([www.kssairambulance.org.uk](http://www.kssairambulance.org.uk)). After meeting the cost of the prize and incidental expenses it is estimated that £3,000 will be raised for the Beneficiary per lottery.

### **TICKETS**

Lottery tickets may be purchased online at [www.chilions.org.uk/spitfire.html](http://www.chilions.org.uk/spitfire.html) or by email request to [spitfire@chilions.org.uk](mailto:spitfire@chilions.org.uk).

Tickets cost £25 each and the maximum number of tickets that will be sold is 250 per lottery. You may purchase as many tickets as you wish.

Electronic numbered tickets will be provided when payment has been received.

### **THE DRAW**

The draw will take place:

- When 250 tickets have been sold
- Or no later than November 30<sup>th</sup> 2016

The winning ticket will be drawn at the offices of Boulton Flight Academy Ltd.

At the sole discretion of Chichester Lions, further lotteries may be initiated in batches of 250 tickets under the same terms and conditions for additional vouchers.

### **THE PRIZE**

Each draw will have a single prize of a voucher for a flight in a Supermarine Spitfire. Currently a North American Mustang is also available and may be substituted at your request. There is no cash alternative prize and the use of the voucher is subject to the terms and conditions of Boulton Flight Academy Ltd (“The Academy”).

The voucher may be transferred, free of charge, to any person nominated by the prize winner and notified to both Chichester Lions and to The Academy before booking the flight.

Chichester Lions make no representations as to the suitability of the prize for specific individuals and it is the responsibility of the purchaser of the lottery ticket to ensure that the intended user of the voucher will meet the criteria set out by The Academy. ### **FLIGHT DETAILS**

All operations of the flight are in accordance with the Terms and Conditions of The Academy which may be found at [www.boultonflightacademy.co.uk](http://www.boultonflightacademy.co.uk)

The flight will take place from Goodwood Aerodrome, Chichester in West Sussex.

The date of the flight will be by mutual agreement between the holder of the voucher (“voucher user”) and The Academy and will be subject to their flight criteria.

Chichester Lions are able to arrange for hotel accommodation at special rates at either the Chichester Park Hotel or the Goodwood Hotel. If travelling from any distance we recommend travelling the day prior to the flight.

Accommodation costs and travel costs are not included in the prize package. Please be aware that at certain times of the year, Goodwood hold events which will result in most hotels within a 20 mile radius being full. During these events, be aware local roads leading to the aerodrome might be heavily congested and/or closed with lengthy diversions in place.

Flight time is calculated on a chock to chock basis. That means that having started the engine, the time starts when the chocks are taken away. The aircraft will then taxi and will await take off clearance. After take-off, the pilot might be obliged to follow noise abatement procedures before undertaking any manoeuvre you might have agreed. The aircraft will head back towards the airfield, re-join the circuit and having landed will taxi back. The engine will be switched off and the chocks replaced.

Chichester Lions are able to provide (at cost) a Pilot's Log Book

Chichester Lions cannot be held responsible for any flights which might last less than the 30 minutes chock to chock time.

The flight is subject to weather conditions and, when making travel arrangements, the voucher user needs to be aware of the risk of deferral if the weather is unsuitable on the day.

Chichester Lions cannot be held responsible for any delay or expenditure incurred as a result of any delay however caused including traffic or transport to enable you to get to the airfield.

Chichester Lions reserve the right to arrange press coverage of the winner's flight, using the local press or other media. The voucher user may request their name to be withheld from any publicity.

## **INSURANCE**

Please note the flight is not classified as a flight on a scheduled or charter airline. As such you must understand that flying is dangerous and consider any personal insurance consequences, including Life Insurances and Personal Injury insurances.

Details of insurance cover provided by the The Academy can be found on their website. Chichester Lions and Lions International do not accept any liability for any loss or injury resulting from the flight itself or from any delay to the flight, howsoever caused.

## **SAFETY RULES**

At Goodwood Aerodrome, all visitors will obey all the safety rules and regulations of the Airfield operators. There will be a full briefing by the Academy on the day.

- Do not approach the aircraft unless accompanied by a member of The Academy despatch crew.
- Do not touch the propeller at any time.
- After your flight, wait until you are assisted to disembark from the aircraft. Always disembark to the rear of the aircraft.
- Whilst 'airside,' always wear a High Visibility Vest.
- If an aircraft appears to be approaching you, **STAND STILL. DO NOT MOVE.** The aircraft should avoid you.
- Do not consume alcohol for 48 hours before the flight. Any passenger found or suspected of being under the influence of drink or drugs might forfeit their ability to fly and the voucher will become invalid.

In the event of any dispute, the Laws of England and Wales will be applied.

## **AND FINALLY**

You are warned that all aspects of flying small aircraft, whilst officially described as dangerous, are in fact highly addictive. Chichester Lions do not take any responsibility for subsequent amounts of money spent by the winner learning to fly and purchasing his own aircraft.
