Who are the Lions

The Lions Club of Chichester was formed nearly 60 years ago as part of LIONS CLUBS INTERNATIONAL (LCI), the world's largest network of service clubs.

Originating in 1917 in Chicago, Illinois, clubs were created to help those in need during the Great Depression. This was expanded over many years and now there are Lions Clubs in over 200 countries to support and assist people wherever they might be in the world regardless of colour or creed.

How do we fit in?

Chichester Lions Club was formed in 1966 to serve the local community of Chichester and the surrounding area. We also support LCI on national and international projects to help those in need, be it from ill-health or natural disasters.

How do we achieve this?



We meet on the first Tuesday of each month

at the Fishbourne Centre, Blackboy Lane at 7.45 pm to talk about our current projects and plan future ones.

You are welcome to join us at any of these meetings to find out more and to meet the members.

A social event is also held each month, usually on the third Tuesday of each month.

The club has a variety of sub committees which help us to manage our projects.

Sight:

This committee organises the recycling of unwanted spectacles, which are received from all over the UK and then processed at our workshop based at the Apuldram Centre. This part of our activities has international recognition.



The reusable spectacles are forwarded to our fellow Lions at Medico France in Le Havre where spectacles are graded.

We have also shipped spectacles directly to known contacts undertaking eye clinics in Papua New Guinea, Sri Lanka, Ghana, Nigeria, Nepal and Zambia

We support volunteers from the Unite for Sight charity with a supply of spectacles to take with them on missions to countries across the world.

Nothing is wasted - materials from spectacles that are unsuitable for recycling are used to raise funds for the project, as well as supporting sight related research and charitable projects around the world, such as the LCI's eye camps which are set up wherever they are needed to treat cataracts and river blindness.

Activities:

This is the committee that arranges the many fundraising events in and around Chichester. These are just a few.

We organise a popular **Swimathon.**allowing local organisations to raise money for their own funds.

Along with other Lions clubs in the area, we supplied enough funds to fit two Kent, Surrey and Sussex Air Ambulances with ground breaking technology to enable them to fly at night. Some of the first helicopters in the UK to be fitted with this vital equipment.

Health & Welfare:

This committee deals with requests for funding or assistance and matters related to health and welfare. They investigate requests and then make recommendations at the monthly business meeting for the whole club to consider.

Lions also support "Message in a Bottle" and "Message in a Wallet", alongside "Medic Alert" which is supported by Lions Clubs within the UK.

These can be a great help to the emergency services as they alert them to vital medical information about a casualty.

Youth:

Chichester Lions have donated a series of children's books to primary schools in the area to help children learn about the environmental impact of plastics in our seas and other environmental issues, which are endangering our wildlife.



Each book follows the story of a well-loved animal as they encounter ocean plastic and how, through the help of people, the animals are rescued, rehabilitated, and released back to their home.

A total 14 schools each received a set of seven books.
